

Rotary District 6690-RY 2021-2022 Peace Building Matching Grant Application

Grants up to \$250 per club
Due Date: August 31, 2021

Purpose of the Peace Building Grant

The first Rotary Area of Focus is Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution. To facilitate the promotion of peace building (PB) in District 6690 in the continuum of personal peace to global peace the district grants will facilitate clubs in development of initiatives that move society forward in the peaceful resolution of conflicts.

Requirements

- A club member must have attended a short District Grant session to understand the parameters of the grant.
- A club must contribute matching funds whether participating individually or in collaboration with other clubs.
- Up to \$250 in matching funds will be reimbursed to eligible clubs upon completion of their grant project and closeout.
- The club must adhere to Rotary International (RI) branding guidelines.
- A club member must be selected to steer the project and designated in DACdb.
- The club must be in good standing with RI and District 6690.
- Applications must be submitted by August 31, 2021.
- Relevant expenses incurred between July 1, 2021 and May 31, 2022 will be eligible for reimbursement. Grant related expenses incurred prior to July 1, 2021 will be considered for reimbursement upon review.

General Criteria for Awarding Grants

- Club's grant project must align with the District PB goals and RI vision for peace, goodwill and understanding throughout the world.
- A club is encouraged to establish a peacebuilding committee and secure recognition as a peace builder club.
- Club members are encouraged to join the Rotary Action Group for Peace (RAGFP) and secure the peace builder club status through the RAGFP.
- The grant application must set forth an outcome that is both measurable and achievable by May 31, 2022, or detail the objectives, activities and time frame for completion of the peace building project if extending beyond the 2021-2022 Rotary year.
- A final report of accomplishments and progress in achieving the goals to be submitted by July 1, 2022.

Awarding of Grant

Grant awards will be determined after all grant applications have been received. The PB Committee will allow two weeks after the 8/31 deadline for clubs to submit application revisions based on the PB Committee feedback. Grant amounts will be determined based on the total number of qualifying clubs and the total district budget for this program. Grant awards will be announced by September 30, 2021. Clubs will be required to submit a grant closeout report with receipts for reimbursement of PB expenses incurred between October 1, 2021 and March 31, 2022. Close out will require a brief writeup, photos, and how well the project succeeded.

Rotary District 6690 reserves the right to use any materials submitted in the grant process to assist other clubs and further the work of the District Peace Building initiatives.
